

1. In preparation for the APRIL 16<sup>th</sup> National Popular Vote Consensus Meeting, please look at the LWVUS web site and read the background materials which is printed there. Also, read IMPACT ON ISSUES, the LWV US positions publication, on Representative Government from pages 6-23.

Consult IMPACT ON ISSUES either online or by reading the hard copy for the LWVUS position on Nuclear Issues found on pages 51-54 for background in the League on the presentation we had in March by Moe Headington. This is a position on which many of us might not be informed and certainly we should be.

## *Background for the National Popular Vote Compact*

The League has a long-standing position in support of the direct election of the president by popular vote. Now, League members have the opportunity to consider whether to support the National Popular Vote Compact (NPV Compact) as a viable process to achieve that result. The NPV Compact would avoid the need for a constitutional amendment abolishing the Electoral College (EC), and would assure that the individual receiving the most votes would become president.

The NPV Compact proposal uses the mechanism of the EC. States that legislatively enact the NPV Compact would agree that their state electors would vote for the individual that received the most votes nationwide. Thus, the popular vote count from all 50 states and the District of Columbia would be added together. State elections officials in all states participating would award their electoral votes to the presidential candidate who receives the largest number of popular votes.

This alternative method of assigning a state's EC votes would take effect only when enacted by states collectively possessing a majority of the electoral votes. This 270-vote threshold also corresponds essentially to states representing a majority of the people of the United States. The plan includes procedural provisions to help assure smooth functioning of the agreement – conditions that deal with states deciding to withdraw from the Compact at the last moment, enforcement issues and recounts.

Currently four states have passed legislation to enact the NPV Compact.

There are pros and cons to this plan, which are discussed in full in papers found on the LWVUS Web site. Summaries of these papers are also available. League members can learn more about the plan from these sources and consider its ramifications at consensus meetings across the country. Be sure to participate! Who better than the League to be ready to speak to this good-government issue?

**Next year State dues will be raised to \$28 and National dues will be raised to \$29.20, for a total of \$57.20 per member. To cover these costs, we propose a raise in dues to \$60 per person and \$90 per household.**

## By- Laws Committee Report

The By-Laws committee has proposed the following revisions, to be voted upon at the Annual Dinner:

Current:

### ARTICLE VI Financial Administration

Section 2. Dues. Dues shall be payable upon initial joining of the League and thereafter annually on the first of April or the first of October, whichever date follows the month in which the member initially joined. Any member who fails to pay the dues within two months after they become payable shall be dropped from the membership rolls. Any proposed change in the amount of dues shall be submitted in writing to the membership at least one month before the Annual Meeting. Approval of a change shall be by a 2/3 vote of members present and voting at the Annual Meeting. When two members reside at the same address in a common household, their combined dues shall be equal to one and a half times the amount of dues for an individual.

Proposed:

### ARTICLE VI Financial Administration

Section 2. Dues. Dues shall be payable upon initial joining of the League and thereafter annually ~~on the first of April or the first of October, whichever date follows the month in which the member initially joined~~ **on the first of September. Members who join after January 31<sup>st</sup> will pay one-half the annual dues for that year.** Any member who fails to pay the dues within two months after they become payable shall be dropped from the membership rolls. Any proposed change in the amount of dues shall be submitted in writing to the membership at least one month before the Annual Meeting. Approval of a change shall be by a 2/3 vote of members present and voting at the Annual Meeting. When two members reside at the same address in a common household, their combined dues shall be equal to one and a half times the amount of dues for an individual.

Current:

### ARTICLE VIII Nominations and Elections

Section 1. Nominating Committee. The Nominating Committee shall consist of five members, two of whom shall be members of the Board of Directors. The Chairman and two members, who shall not be members of the Board, shall be elected at the Annual Meeting. Nominations for these offices shall be made by the current Nominating Committee. The other members shall be appointed by the Board of Directors immediately following the Annual Meeting. Suggestions for nominations for Officers and Directors may be sent to this committee by any voting member.

Section 2. Report of Nominating Committee and Nominations from the Floor. The report of the Nominating Committee of its nominations for Officers, Directors, and members of the succeeding Nominating Committee shall be sent to all members at least one month before the date of the Annual Meeting. Individuals may also send suggestions to the Chairman of the Nominating Committee. The Chairman of the Nominating Committee shall request suggestions at least three months before the selection of nominees. The report of the Nominating Committee shall be presented at the Annual Meeting. Immediately following the presentation of this report, nominations may be made from the floor by any voting member provided the consent of the nominee shall have been secured.

ARTICLE VIII  
Nominations and Elections

Section 1. Nominating Committee. The Nominating Committee shall consist of five members, two of whom shall be members of the Board of Directors. The Chairman and two members, who shall not be members of the Board, shall be elected at the Annual Meeting. Nominations for these offices shall be made by the current Nominating Committee. The other members shall be appointed by the Board of Directors immediately following the Annual Meeting. **The Chairman of the Nominating Committee shall request suggestions at least three months before the selection of nominees.** Suggestions for nominations for Officers and Directors may be sent to this committee by any voting member.

Section 2. Report of Nominating Committee and Nominations from the Floor. The report of the Nominating Committee of its nominations for Officers, Directors, and members of the succeeding Nominating Committee shall be sent to all members at least one month before the date of the Annual Meeting. ~~Individuals may also send suggestions to the Chairman of the Nominating Committee.~~ The report of the Nominating Committee shall be presented at the Annual Meeting. Immediately following the presentation of this report, nominations may be made from the floor by any voting member provided the consent of the nominee shall have been secured.


