

## Presidents' Message May 2009



And sure enough, April showers did bring May flowers! The magnolias, daffodils, tulips, hyacinths and even violets are in great shape. So let's get on with our work!

The National Popular Vote consensus meeting was one challenging bit of work understanding what this means for the Country in electing our Presidents every four years. The study committee, Roberta Jacobson, Joan Fefferman and Tom Kay did their part explaining the ramifications and facts associated with the pros and cons of the issue as well as filling in the background information. It was important for us all to concentrate and sort out whether the pro side or con side made a difference or whether we could not reach consensus on a question. For newer members, this being a National League study, the study materials came to us and all leagues around the Country after the National study committee did the research and supplied the results of that to all Leagues. The consensus questions were the same for all and the study papers were the same for all.

LWVUS positions can be found in IMPACT ON ISSUES, hard copies or online and I encourage every member to read the positions little by little and become acquainted with what League stands for on all kinds of issues. On page 18 & 19 of the 2006-2008 issue you will be able to read the "Selection of the President" position and will see we have a position to abolish the Electoral College and that "the direct-popular-vote method for electing the President and Vice-President is essential to representative government."

So, this National Popular Vote study if adopted by National would lead us onward towards the abolition of the Electoral College, but would skirt the amendment to the U.S. Constitution process. Let's wait and see how the consensus around the Country comes in.

As of this writing, my head is still swirling from playing host to a forum on gun violence prevention which was geared mainly to the high school students of the area. The presentation was sponsored by the IL Campaign for Gun Violence Prevention as well as the LWVIL and our league, LWV Naperville and G.E. league. The League of Voters at Wheaton North had worked alongside of the Campaign in planning for the event. These kind of events can bring many unknown aspects to the forefront and I imagine anything to do with legislation around gun controls might well be one of the most explosive [no pun intended] of issues. We did find this to be true at the forum.

The ANNUAL MEETING IS NEXT!! THURSDAY, MAY 21st is the date. Café Galicia is the place and the time is 6:30 p.m. Contact Barb Pape to make your reservations or check your April VOTER for the announcement and reservation slip to send back to her with the dollars. We have lots of surprises in store, including a special honor being given to one of our members. Also we have to adopt the budget, by laws changes and elect the new board.

Speaking of the latter, this is my final letter to you in my term as President. What a privilege it has been to serve the Wheaton League these past four years. I couldn't be more proud of all you have accomplished by working together on so many projects. We now have 7 Action groups active in addition to many of you working with various coalitions related to these committees. The Board has been absolutely great, always at the ready and completing the various tasks in good time. People have taken off board jobs, one-time jobs and ongoing jobs so willingly. I have not ever (and I mean never) felt someone turned down a job with anything but a gracious reason for not being able to accomplish whatever it meant. That is terrific and remarkable. I am sure leaders of any organization would wish for that kind of a membership.

We have increased the membership and even won an award from LWVIL for our increase. Participation in league meetings has always been tops, no matter what the weather! Para league groups such as Great Decisions have nearly maxed out Betty Bradshaw's home and they even have grown through the studies of the heavy issues in foreign policies.

I have stressed that League is now in the implementation stage, meaning we are taking the positions off the pages and working at carrying out activity and advocacy to make those positions a reality. That would make our founders proud!! Keep up the good work! As is said, Rome was not built in a day! No one knows that more than we League women and men.

Speaking of men in League, we have our first elected man Board member ever in our Unit. In fact, Frank Goetz even represented our League at National Convention last June, bringing the proposed study to establish a Dept. of Peace in the US Cabinet before the body for consideration. Wow! I know it didn't get adopted, but remember "Rome..."

One of the greatest happenings in these four years is the formation of the League of Voters at Wheaton North High School!!! Members Joan and Robert Fefferman's daughter, Ann, envisioned an opportunity open to high school students for greater understanding of public policy and public good and put together this new organization when she was a Junior and now three years later the LOV has continued to flourish with new leaders and new members continuing on with the same vision. This is remarkable.

Well, there are, and should be, many more accomplishments to acknowledge, but space and your concentration need to be respected. ### **Education** Carol Elias

The Education Committee meets monthly, with the last meeting April 22, 2009 at 12:30 PM at Carol Elias' house. Committee members have been attending School Board Meetings and gathering information regarding the District's Budget and their Finance Committee recommendations. We are suggesting that the Wheaton LWV have a program at one of our first Fall meetings to update members and the public on Education issues.

### **Environment** Diane Niesman

The March program about the dangers of transporting nuclear waste for reprocessing, presented by Maureen Headington, was well attended and well received.

### **Healthcare** Sue Davison & Gwen Wharton

The Wheaton League of Women Voters was represented by Gwen Wharton at DuPage County's first I-PLAN 2015 (Illinois Project for Local Assessment of Needs) meeting on March 18. This was the Local Public Health System Assessment sponsored by the DuPage County Health Department. By state statute every Illinois certified health department is required to conduct an I-PLAN at five-year intervals.

The agenda for this meeting addressed the "Ten Essential Public Health Services" that are needed to assure that the health needs of communities are adequately met. The ten services discussed in depth were:

1. Monitor Health Status to Identify Community Health Problems
2. Diagnose and Investigate Health Problems and Health Hazards in the Community
3. Inform, Educate and Empower People about Health Issues
4. Mobilize Community Health Partnerships to Identify and Solve Health Problems
5. Develop Policies and Plans to Support Individual and Community Health Efforts
6. Enforce Laws and Regulations that Protect Health and Ensure Safety
7. Link People to Needed Personal Health Services and Assure the Provision of Healthcare When Otherwise Unavailable
8. Assure a Competent Public and Personal Health Care Workforce
9. Evaluate Effectiveness, Accessibility, and Quality of Personal and Population-Based Services
10. Research for New Insights and Innovative Solutions to Health Problems

Several hundred community partners attended this assessment. They included those from the League of Women Voters, doctors, and workers from police and fire departments, colleges, churches, hospitals, health services and social services (for citizens of all ages). Everyone worked together to assess local health services. We divided into groups of interest for each of the

ten services, in order to establish a broad consensus of the current status of each service. We used the Local Public Health System Assessment Tool, developed for strategic planning purposes by the Center for Disease Control. We rated sub-categories of the services from optimal to minimal or no activity, and after much discussion came to a broad consensus.

The Wheaton League's Health Care Committee is well-positioned to observe and influence the local community health planning process over the coming year. The community and public health system partners reconvene in January 2010, and I-PLAN 2015 will be implemented in April 2010. We are privileged to be a part of I-PLAN 2015.

Next year the Healthcare Committee will follow I-PLAN 2015, work on the Social Policy Position: Mental Health and monitor any new positions from the National League. We are a small committee and welcome new members.

Planning and Zoning Board Member Neil Pollock will represent the board, and the neighborhood representatives will be David A. Armbrust, John C. Buckingham and Cheryl Cross.

**City Council Approves Fiscal Year 2009-2010 Budget**

The Council unanimously approved an ordinance adopting the City of Wheaton Fiscal Year 2009-2010 Budget. A public hearing took place on April 13 regarding the budget, and the Council and City staff discussed the budget during three public budget workshop sessions. The budget includes revenues of \$73,908,007 (all funds) and expenditures of \$75,730,181 (all funds); with the General Fund having \$35,446,421 in revenues and \$34,892,764 in expenditures.




