**Meeting: July 21, 2008**

### **Spare Change Donations Can Help Children through Fundraiser**



Mayor Gresk presented a proclamation to Dr. Weber honoring the “Make a Change in a Child’s Life” fundraising event July 21-31, 2008. The fundraiser encourages participants to collect spare change to be donated to Children’s Memorial Hospital in conjunction with the Eric and Kathy Radiothon. Donations can be made at Dr. Weber’s office, 210 W. Willow.

### **Council Approves Veterans Shelter Expansion**

The City Council voted unanimously in favor of approving special use permits to allow the Midwest Shelter for Homeless Veterans to expand the shelter from 2,400 to 7,400 square feet and increase its occupancy to house 15 veterans. The shelter, which is located in the C-4 Central Business District Perimeter Commercial District, provides basic shelter, psychotherapy, job training, education, legal assistance and independent living skills for U.S. veterans.

### **Agreement Established for Wesley Street Bridge**

The Council voted unanimously to approve an agreement between the City and the Union Pacific Railroad to replace the Wesley Street Bridge over the railroad tracks. The City will remove the existing bridge, which is owned by Union Pacific, and construct a new bridge that will be owned and maintained by the City. The agreement also identified the financial commitments for Union Pacific and the City.

### **Alley Reconstruction Project to Use Permeable Pavers**

To reconstruct concrete public alleys in the central business district, the City received bids for several different options, including the type of material used and the number of alleys to be constructed during this budget year. The Council voted 4-3 in favor of reconstructing one alley with permeable pavers, which are designed to be environmentally friendly by providing stormwater management.

### **Proclamation Honors Purple Heart Recipients**



Mayor Michael Gresk presented a proclamation to Ken Jacobs, president of the local Military Order of the Purple Heart chapter. The proclamation honored Purple Heart recipients and military service members who serve our nation.

## **Council Allows Downtown Development to Move Forward**

To allow for the demolition and redevelopment of the Bell Transmission building at 302 W. Front St. into a retail building, the City Council approved variations to the setback and parking requirements for the property. The project has been on hold as the developer has waited for the City to develop new parking guidelines based on the results of a downtown parking survey. The Council accepted City staff's recommendation for the developer to pay a fee in lieu of meeting parking requirements for a C-4 zoned property.

## **Residents Appointed to Housing Commission**

The Council approved the appointment of Thomas Hudock, Elsa Miller and Chris Ellerman to three-year terms on the Housing Commission.

Mayor Michael Gresk presented a proclamation to Army Specialist Thomas Malmborg, son of Eric and Aynne Malmborg of Wheaton and a graduate of Glenbard South High School, in recognition of his military service. Malmborg is serving his first tour of duty in Iraq and received the Iraq Campaign Ribbon, Overseas Deployment Ribbon, National Defense Ribbon and the Global War on Terrorism Ribbon. The City Council

thanked him for his service to our nation.

## **Kiwanis Club to Host Vintage Base Ball Game**

In honor of Wheaton's Sesquicentennial Celebration, Mayor Gresk invited residents to attend the Kiwanis Club of Wheaton's Vintage Base Ball Game at Seven Gables Park on Aug. 24. Wheaton dads will play against the Chicago Salmon Semi-Professional Base Ball Team using 1858 rules and an authentic 19th century base ball, bases and uniforms. To honor the game, Mayor Gresk read a proclamation making Aug. 24 Kiwanis Club Vintage Base Ball Day in Wheaton.

## **Turn Wheaton Green Campaign Highlighted**



In following the City Council's goal to pursue green initiatives, Mayor Gresk recognized the City of Wheaton's "Turn Wheaton Green" campaign. With the purpose of educating residents about environmental issues and encouraging them to take action, the campaign includes a new section of the City's website, programming on City of Wheaton Channel 10, articles in the City newsletter and other communications materials. Mayor Gresk

presented a proclamation to Public Relations Coordinator Susan Bishel highlighting the campaign, and Bishel presented organic cotton T-shirts with the “Turn Wheaton Green” logo to the Council.

### **Sept. 20 is Fun Run Day**



Chris Wood of the N.E.W. 200 Foundation accepted a proclamation from Mayor Gresk in honor of the organization’s Fun Run on Sept. 20 at Hubble Middle School. The foundation supports all of the schools within Community Unit School District 200 by providing funding for programs and educational opportunities. The proclamation marks Sept. 20 as “N.E.W. 200 Foundation Fun Run Day” in Wheaton.

### **Council Authorizes Agreement for Lake Dredging**

The City Council voted to authorize a professional engineering services agreement for the Streams Lake Dredging Project. The project will include the dredging of the Streams Lake System just west of Creekside Drive.

### **Ordinance Amending Budget Passed**

The Council voted in favor of amending the 2007-2008 budget for several accounting funds in which the total actual projected expenditures have exceeded the respective budget amounts. All of the funds have sufficient revenues to pay for the increased expenditures.

#### **Recognitions & Achievements**

Dr. Drury recognized the Wheaton Warrenville South High School men’s volleyball team that won the IHSA State Championship this past spring. Head coach Bill Schreier and the team were present, and they received certificates of achievement from the Board of Education.

Dr. Drury introduced and recognized Mark Schmidt, a 2008 graduate of Wheaton Warrenville South High School. Mark earned a number of awards and achievements during his high school career, including being state champion in speech. Representatives from the Illinois State Board of Education were present to award Mark with a resolution from the State Board for his achievement in the National Poetry Out Loud competition.

Greg Gauthier, a 2008 WNHS graduate, and Curt Peterson, a 2008 WWSHS graduate, were among the five high school students who represented the State of Illinois against teams from 27 other states to win the first prize in the 21<sup>st</sup> annual Panasonic Academic Challenge. This premier high school academic competition was held at the Walt Disney World’s Contemporary Hotel in

Orlando. This is the 2<sup>nd</sup> consecutive year that Illinois has won this championship. Greg Gauthier was chosen to the All American Team for the second consecutive year, and he is only the third student in the history of the competition to receive this honor two years in a row. Each of the students received a \$2500 scholarship. The team answered questions in subjects that included math, science, language arts, social studies, fine arts, foreign languages and technology.

The WNHS Library was one of 40 high school libraries in Illinois to win a set of twenty two 2009 Abraham Lincoln books from the first annual Illinois School Library Media Association/Library Book Selection Services (ISLMA/LBSS) Endowment Fund Grant. WNHS Librarian Jeri Ramp submitted this grant proposal last spring. The books will be in the school and ready for student use when school opens next week. Thanks to Jeri Ramp for her efforts in obtaining this great addition to the WNHS Library.

**The Board took the following action:**

- Approved the continuation of the Intergovernmental Agreement with the City of Wheaton for two liaison patrol officers, one at each of the high schools.
- Approved to re-post policy 6.210, Instructional Material, and the AR for public review and comment for 30 days. This policy addresses R-rated movies in classrooms, and the latest revision removes a previous ban on foreign films.
- Approved to post the tentative budget for the 2008-09 fiscal year. A Public Hearing will be held on Wednesday, September 24, 2008 with adoption to be considered at the Board meeting following the hearing.






