Healthcare

Members of the committee met on 8/25/08. We reviewed web-based resources of information about health care reform. A favorite site currently is that of the Kaiser Family Foundation, www.kff.org; however, we plan to monitor a broad spectrum of health policy views available on the internet. We will also attend some of the meetings related to health care access held in our local area during the fall.

The recent LWVUS Convention made health care reform a league priority. We expect health care issues will be prominent when the next Congress convenes and the next President and his cabinet take office early next year. Since we are responsible for the Wheaton League’s March 19, 2009 unit meeting, we hope that we can tap into national health care policy issues via LWVUS. We are eager to hear whether an application from our League to assist the newly-forming LWVUS Health Care Education Team is successful.

Current members are following the emerging health care planks of both parties’ platforms. These include:

- National efforts to enact parity for mental health care insurance coverage (related to the LWVIL mental health position);
- Local, state and federal emergency preparedness with respect to a possible influenza pandemic;

- Efforts to establish an Office of the National Nurse to encourage health promotion and the prevention of chronic disease;
- And the DuPage County Health Department (as part of our league's local health care position).

Over the coming months we expect to welcome new members, and their availability and preferences may change our calendar. The committee currently meets at 7 P.M. on the fourth Tuesday of the month. Contact Sue Davison for details.

Housing Kathy Kregor

Wheaton is at an exciting crossroad as the council seeks to address housing issues. Put your ideas to work by joining the Housing Workgroup. We meet the third Wednesday at noon at the Peoples' Resource Center beginning in October (then every other month). Please contact Kathy Kregor if you have any questions.

Our focus this year, in support of the League's affordable housing position, is:

1. Getting policies in place that support our position, by working with city officials and the Housing Commission.
2. Facilitating education and advocacy efforts within the community and Wheaton League by identifying possible audiences for the group: Homeownership: Benchmark for a Vital Community. Their speakers' bureau does presentations on affordable homeownership needs and solutions in DuPage
3. Selecting appropriate housing advocacy alerts; getting approval from the Wheaton LWV President, and requesting distribution from the Action Chair.
4. Creating a check list of information we need to review about affordable housing project proposals, before recommending any such proposal for League support.

Meeting: Sept. 15, 2008

Wheaton Congratulates Olympic Gold Medalist

Mayor Michael Gresk presented a proclamation to Sean Rooney, a Wheaton Warrenville South High School graduate, for winning an Olympic Gold Medal at the 2008 Beijing Olympic Games. Rooney is part of the U.S. men's volleyball team, which won a gold medal on Aug. 24, 2008, defeating Brazil for the first medal by a U.S. men's volleyball team since 1988. He began playing volleyball while attending Wheaton Warrenville South, and has since played at Pepperdine, in the Korean League and for a Russian team. Rooney thanked the Council for the recognition and stated that he is very proud to be from Wheaton.

Earth Summit Awareness Week is Sept. 15-22



Sister Shelia Kinsey of the Wheaton Franciscan Sisters accepted a proclamation making Sept. 15-22 Earth Summit Awareness Week in Wheaton. The Wheaton Franciscan Campus, 26W171 Roosevelt Road, will host the Earth Summit Climate Change Festival from 8 a.m. to 6:30 p.m. Oct. 11. The community is invited to attend to celebrate local

environmental efforts and explore options to further this effort.

Vote on Home Rule Sales Tax Postponed

The City Council has been discussing a possible increase in the Home Rule Sales Tax rate since 2005 to help balance the difference between rising expenditures and falling revenues in the City's finances. If approved, the proposed increase would raise the Home Rule Sales Tax rate from 0.5 percent to 1 percent. The Council decided to postpone voting on the ordinance because of two City Council members' absence. A Special City Council Meeting has been called for Monday, Sept. 22, for the Council to vote on the ordinance. Mayor Gresk encouraged residents to visit the City's website, www.wheaton.il.us, to view meeting agendas and minutes and to sign up for Email Updates to have information delivered by email.

Residents Appointed to Commissions

The Wheaton City Council appointed Steve Hanika to the Sesquicentennial Commission for a term ending Dec. 31, 2009, and appointed Chris Wehr to the Sister City Commission for a three-year term.

Council Discusses Wheaton College Building Project

The City Council discussed a report from the Planning and Zoning Board regarding Wheaton College's application to build a new science building at University Place and Howard Street. At a previous public hearing, residents expressed concerns about an increase in traffic that could

occur as a result of the project. The City is currently performing a traffic study and working with the college to address possible issues. The Planning and Zoning Board recommended approval of the application contingent on several conditions, as the board and City staff believe the traffic issue is not directly related to the new building and should not hinder the approval of the application. An ordinance will be prepared for the Council to vote upon.

Council Approves Firefighters Union Contract

The City Council approved an agreement with the Wheaton Firefighters Union for a five-year contract. The provisions include adjusted health insurance premiums, wage adjustments, a change in the longevity payment period and post-employment health plans.

Council Amends Agreement for Intersection Engineering

The City Council approved a resolution amending the agreement with the Illinois Department of Transportation and DuPage County for preliminary engineering at Roosevelt Road and County Farm Road. The agreement shares the cost for engineering studies for proposed improvements at the intersection. The proposed changes would include widening the intersection to add turn lanes and improved vehicular and pedestrian access to St. Francis High School, among other improvements. The amendment was needed to fund additional costs associated with the engineering study.

Public Hearing

A public hearing was held on the District's intention to request modification to State Code to allow students to attend school in District 200 on Veteran's Day. The hearing is part of the process required by the State in seeking such a modification. District 200 has held school on Veteran's Day for many years and has celebrated Veterans and their service throughout the District. This modification of the Code would be for five years.

Superintendent Report

Dr. Drury encouraged people to go to the District's Website, www.cusd200.org, and view a speech presented by 2008 WWSHS graduate, Mark Schmidt, entitled, "A Graduate's Perspective". Mark addressed new teachers joining District 200 this year at their induction session. His comments reflect his experiences as a student in District 200 and underscore the impact that teachers have on the students they serve. This is a powerful message that everyone should hear.

Staff and students from host school, Sandburg Elementary, shared with the Board their work with technology. They demonstrated the use of "remote clickers", a new technology device that

allows students to respond to teacher posed questions through the use of an electronic, wireless key pad. The device records answers to questions and instantly gives feedback to the students and teacher. This technology allows teachers to immediately see how many students have answered the questions, which questions were answered correctly and informs the teacher what concepts have been mastered and what topics may need more instruction. The Board members took part in a simulation of the “clickers” with help from Sandburg students. Presenting this new instructional tool for the Board were Sandburg fifth grade teachers, Margo Brown, Ben Huggins, and LLC Director Kristin Northrup.

The Board took the following action:

Approved the list of Serious Safety Hazard studies that have been filed with the Illinois Department of Transportation. There is one addition to the list which otherwise remains the same as last year.


