The Governor's debate will also include panelists Thomas and Shaw. The third panelist will be announced shortly.

❖ **Vote411 – NEW ONLINE VOTERS GUIDE TO COVER ALL STATE RACES IN ILLINOIS**

The Illinois League will be doing an online Voters Guide through the National League's [VOTE411](#) website. Our section will cover the following races: Governor, Attorney General, Secretary of State, Comptroller, Treasurer, US Senator, congressional Representatives, State Reps, and those State Senatorial districts that are up for election. **The Voters Guide will go live on October 12** - the first day of early voting – Letters were also sent to candidates in DuPage County races asking them to participate in the guide.

❖ **RECALL OF THE GOVERNOR PROPOSED AMENDMENT (HJRC31) TO THE ILLINOIS CONSTITUTION**

At the November 2, 2010, General Election, voters will be asked to decide whether the Illinois Constitution should be amended to add a new Section 7 to Article III, Suffrage and Elections. The proposed amendment would provide for a special election to recall a governor and for a special election to elect a successor governor. **The LWVIL has more information online, just follow these links.**

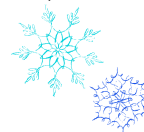

### **Education**

This month we participated in the September 16th opening dinner conversation and advertised the committee. The Education committee has long been an active and interesting part of the League. Whether you have children in District 200 or not, everyone is concerned with the education and the success of our children.

Last year we worked extremely hard on the budget cuts of the district. We also were involved in commenting on the resignation of Dr. Drury, and participated in the committee of the community that reviewed candidates for Superintendent. Bill Farley, financial director of the district, spoke to the League and met privately with our committee about the future of the schools. We focused on the severe budget cuts that were needed to meet the dwindling revenue coming to the district from the state and other sources.

This year should be interesting when the effects of the cuts are felt. If you are interested, we would be pleased to have you join us. We know already that we will need Board of Education Observers. Our meetings are the second and fourth Wednesday of the month. On September 21st, at 9:15 AM we will meet at Joan Fefferman's home, to plan our direction and determine the areas of interest we want to concentrate on.

### **Environment & Healthcare**

The "Navistar in Lisle" story appears to be finally resolved. The headquarters will be moving into the former Lucent building in Lisle, but the diesel testing facility, which worried nearby residents about both health and pollution effects, will be at the Navistar plant in Melrose Park.

The next Electronic Recycling will be Saturday, October 9th, from 9 AM to Noon. Bring anything you can plug in and household batteries, too, to the Wheaton Public Works Facility at 821 E. Liberty.

## **Housing**

With the economy being in such straits in Illinois, lower income individuals and families are feeling the impact of fewer services to help them keep family needs met, not the least of these is sufficient income to afford their housing.

Housing problems include a huge foreclosure situation with money not being made available to prevent foreclosure on a house which has been home to a family, often for years. There have been legislative efforts to aid in slowing or preventing some foreclosures, but not enough have been successful.

Programs funded through stimulus dollars have helped to get forsaken houses back in livable shape and sold to new buyers or rented. DuPage County has taken the lead in successfully using all the dollars available. Through Community Housing Assoc. of DuPage, Habitat for Humanity and the DuPage Housing Authority, abandoned houses have been purchased, and restored, so they are once again in the housing market in the affordable housing range.

Wheaton has had the addition of affordable housing as a priority for a year, but unfortunately the economy has played havoc with the municipal budget, thus putting the housing priority on the inactive list so far. The League Housing Workgroup will be continuing to keep ourselves aware of any opportunity to activate this priority. There are mechanisms which will aid getting affordable housing in Wheaton. Stay tuned.

The Housing Workgroup will hold our first meeting of the year to resume planning our efforts toward more affordable housing for Wheaton. We also will continue our participation in the DuPage Housing Action Coalition [DHAC] as well as being active with Business and Professional People for the Public Interest, Housing Action IL and the Housing Roundtable in IL.

### ***Wheaton City Council Highlights Meeting: Sept. 7, 2010***

#### **Local Parent Teacher Association Recognized**



In honor of the Wheaton-Warrenville School District 200 Parent Teacher Association, Mayor Gresk presented a proclamation to Leslie Kocher, vice president of the Wheaton-Warrenville PTA Council. The proclamation makes September Wheaton-Warrenville School District 200 PTA Membership Recognition Month and encourages residents to join and participate in their local school's PTA.

#### **Wheaton to Honor Constitution Week**



Members of the Perrin-Wheaton Chapter of the National Society Daughters of the American Revolution accepted a proclamation honoring Constitution Week Sept. 17-23 in Wheaton. It celebrates the 223rd anniversary of the drafting of the United States Constitution.

#### **Residents Encouraged to Participate in Car Free Day**

On Sept. 22, the City of Wheaton encourages residents to participate in World Car Free Day, which is celebrated in 1,500 cities and 40 countries. Mayor Gresk read a proclamation stating Wheaton's participation in the event, which is intended to remind people about their transportation options, environmental impacts and other quality of life issues that are within an individual's control.

## **City's Purchasing Officer Receives Award**



City of Wheaton Purchasing Officer Joan Schouten accepted an award from Mayor Gresk given by the Universal Public Purchasing Certification Council naming the City a Sterling Agency. The City received the award for having maintained three consecutive years as a certified agency.

## **Resident Reappointed to Commission**

The City Council approved the reappointment of Bill Austin to a three-year term on the Fine & Cultural Arts Commission.

## **Council Authorizes Additional Funding for Flood Control Project**

To address additional engineering services needed for the North Main Street Flood Control Project, the Council authorized additional funding. The City entered into an engineering services agreement with Christopher B. Burke Engineering Ltd. in 2007 to provide design and permitting services for this project. The project scope has changed due to permit requirements and additional work unforeseen when the project was developed. The additional work will cost \$225,500.

## **Resolution States City's Intent to Use Countywide Emergency Radio Dispatch System**

The Council passed a resolution that formalizes the City's intent to switch over to a countywide emergency radio system using Motorola's STARCOM21 infrastructure. The Emergency Telephone System Board and police and fire departments in DuPage County are working to implement a system that will offer interoperability among the different entities for improved communication and safety.

## ***Wheaton City Council Highlights Meeting: Sept. 20, 2010***

### **Commission, Chamber Participating in Make a Difference Day**



Mayor Gresk presented proclamations to both the City's Community Relations Commission and the Wheaton Chamber of Commerce for their participation in Make a Difference Day projects. The commission will be leading the City's efforts to collect items for people in need and Operation Support Our Troops. In addition, the Chamber will be collecting non-perishable food items for the People's Resource Center in Wheaton. The City encourages residents to get involved with these projects or other activities on this national day of doing good, Saturday, Oct. 23, 2010.



## **Noise Ordinance Amended**

The City Council approved an amendment to the City Code related to loud music or noises. The change lists a number of exemptions from noise level regulations, including construction and grounds maintenance from 7 a.m. to sunset; emergency equipment and alarms; church bells; recreational facilities, parks and schools from 9 a.m. to 10 p.m.; and outdoor musical performances when approved by the City Council at least 14 days in advance.

## **Sewer Lining Agreement Approved**

The City Council approved an annual services agreement with Insituform Technologies USA Inc., the company that has been performing trenchless pipe rehabilitation for City sewers since 1990. The agreement allows City staff to provide work orders for various projects throughout the year without the necessity of separate contracts. The agreement sets costs at the same price as the last contract in 2008. Crews will perform about 5 miles of sewer lining at a cost of approximately \$1.1 million.

## ***Board of Education Highlights September 8, 2010 – Bower Elementary School***

### **Public Hearing:**

On January 1, 2008, the Illinois General Assembly enacted legislation that significantly modified the Illinois' Graduated Driver Licensing program. The most important part of that legislation changed the delivery system of the high school driver education program when it imposed an increased number of on the road, behind-the-wheel (BTW) hours from three to six and excluded the time students spend on simulators. This change in the law has reduced the number of students the District had been able to service. The waiver is requesting approval to count up to three hours of simulator equivalency (four hours simulation equals one hour BTW) training towards the six hour BTW requirement. In December 2009, the District applied for a five year waiver of the State Code related to the use of simulation training for driver education. While the General Assembly approved the waiver for 2010-11, it denied the request for the subsequent four years. We are resubmitting this request for the full five year waiver.

### **Superintendent Report:**

Dr. Harris reported the 10 day District student enrollment of 13,481, a decline of only 125 students from last year. As part of the effort to balance this year's budget, the District has reduced 50 teaching positions.

While there is a slight decline in overall enrollment, some of the elementary schools have experienced increases resulting in challenging class size situations. As the District has monitored these classes, additional teachers have been added to reduce class size. This week teachers were added to Hawthorne and Madison Elementary Schools to address class size and staff was added to Lincoln, Washington, Johnson, Hawthorne, Washington, Madison, Sandburg, and Lincoln to accommodate increases in students identified as English Language Learners (ELL). The District's ELL population has

increased this year by over 200 students which was the impetus for the additional teachers.

Enrollments at the high schools and middle schools have been stable with the exception of Franklin's sixth grade. Additional sections are being considered at Franklin.

**The Board took the following action:**

Approved to file with the Illinois Department of Transportation a listing of Serious Safety Hazard Bus Routes within the District. Upon reviewing the previous list, one route relative to students walking to old Hubble Middle School was removed; there were no other changes made to the list.

**Discussion Item:**

The Board discussed changing the structure of the monthly meetings. At the next meeting, they will vote on a proposal to change their second meeting of the month from a traditional action meeting to a meeting of the whole. This meeting will allow Board members to spend more time discussing issues in a workshop format. No action would be taken at this meeting. The meeting of the whole would be held at the School Service Center on the fourth Wednesday of the month. The proposal is to continue to include an opportunity for citizen comments related to both agenda and non-agenda items.
