## Action Roundup

### An Evening with Your Legislators

The Wheaton League kicked off the 2011-2012 year with “Meet Your Legislators” on 9/22/11. Over 50 people attended and were able to hear IL State Senator Tom Johnson, Senator Carole Pankau and Representative Sandra Pihos give short presentations about their legislative philosophies and issues they feel are important in Springfield. Then, audience members asked questions in a town hall style format, with Lori Miller ably walking around the room with a microphone to raised hands. Both the audience and legislators seemed to like the format, based on the positive comments as people left.



Senator Johnson spoke passionately about his support for prison reform, especially the sentences for drug related convictions. He also thinks out of the box and supports biennial sessions of the General Assembly...every two years, with length of terms for representatives changed to four years and state senators to six years. Senator Johnson will not be running for reelection in 2012.

Senator Pankau said the budget would be the most important issue. She said Republicans want the 67% tax hike to be truly temporary. She accused the Democratic majority of kicking the problem down the road. She also worries about people and businesses leaving Illinois for other states due to the taxes. She thinks state pensions need to be reformed. She also noted that Illinois spends more on Medicaid than on elementary and secondary education combined.



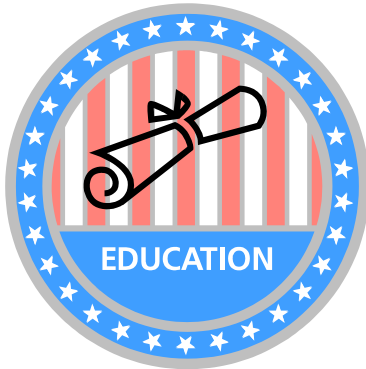
Representative Pihos talked about the lack of and need for transparency in state government. She thinks the upcoming veto session could be very interesting and results could be surprising because so many incumbent representatives will not be running for reelection, partially due to redistricting. She thinks the vote to overturn Governor Quinn’s veto of ComEd’s smart grid bill. She voted for the smart grid and voted against more

gambling casinos. She said statistics show more casinos do not translate into more revenue for the state.

She commented on workman's comp and education reform. She thinks the legislative audit committee is a waste. They don't look into private contracts such as the one the state signed with IBM for IT employees.

## **EDUCATION STUDY**

**The November 17<sup>th</sup> consensus meeting begins at 6:30 PM at the Community Center.**



In the first hour we'll highlight the issues, covering the history of the federal role in education, common core standards, and funding and equity issues, as well as local, state and national LWV policy positions relevant to the study. Missey Wilhelm will facilitate our meeting, and Beth O'Malley will record the discussion.

By 7:30, we'll have begun what is sure to be a lively discussion on the questions. It will be important to keep our remarks brief, and to the point. We may reach consensus on a question, or we may not. At 8:50 PM, we will review the recorder's notes and reaffirm the sense of our meeting. And we'll be done by 9 PM.

Soon after the consensus meeting, the committee will present the results to our board for approval; when approved, we'll submit the results to LWVUS.

Your committee members have been preparing through reading and writing about the issues. We've done a first run-through of our presentations and plan a final rehearsal early in November.

Lately there have been lots of articles on education in the newspapers. If you read them and have also read through the LWVUS materials (available via links on our website), you should be well prepared for the discussion. But if you have not done so, now is the perfect time to begin your preparation. There is plenty of time to review the materials, and to think about the 15 consensus questions, available in the leader's guide.

## **Sept. 6, 2011 City Council Meeting Highlights**

### **Council Approves Parking Restriction**

The Council voted 4-3 in favor of an ordinance prohibiting parking on the south side of Lincoln Avenue from Ellis Avenue to Washington Street and on the north side of Lincoln Avenue from the Winfield Creek Bridge to Sherwin Street. The restrictions are related to the redevelopment of the property at 935 W. Union Ave. into a church.

### **Residents Appointed to Commissions**

The City Council approved the reappointment of Mike Bock and Dee Hicks to three-year terms on the Fine & Cultural Arts Commission; the reappointment of Mark Kmiecik to a three-year term on the Group Care Home Commission; and the reappointment of Nathan Bossenga and the appointment of Max Williams to three-year terms on the Wheaton Downtown Design Review Board.

### **Intergovernmental Agreement Reached for School Liaison Officer Program**

The Council unanimously approved an intergovernmental agreement between the City and Community Unit School District 200 for the School Liaison Officer Program. In the agreement, the Wheaton Police Department places two

Wheaton Police Officers in the district's two high schools and three middle schools. The new agreement has been updated to more accurately reflect the costs associated with the officers providing the liaison service.

### Council Postpones Vote on Special Service Area

Because the City has not received financial audit statements due Sept. 1 under the current Special Service Area agreement between the Downtown Wheaton Association and the City, the City Council voted to postpone a decision regarding a new Special Service Area agreement. The ordinance will be formally considered at the Sept. 19, 2011 City Council meeting.

## Sept. 19, 2011 City Council Meeting Highlights

### Council Votes 4-3 to Proceed with Special Service Area Public Hearing

The City Council voted 4-3 to proceed with a public hearing regarding the proposed establishment of Special Service Area 7. The proposed ordinance would establish a new special service area in downtown Wheaton with a rate of 0.45 per \$100 of assessed value, compared with the current rate of 0.95 for Special Service Area 6. The funds collected through this Special Service Area would be used to fund the operations of the Downtown Wheaton Association and its activities, as outlined in an agreement that the City and Downtown Wheaton Association would create. A public hearing to consider Special Service Area 7 will take place Oct. 10, 2011.

### Council Considers Ordinance Regarding Auxiliary Police Unit

The Council received the first reading of an ordinance adding language to the City Code relating to the training program for auxiliary police officers. The additional wording would provide the Chief of Police with the responsibility of establishing, supervising and administering the curriculum and training program.
